Mr. Giguere has served as a senior representative to the Air Transport Association of Canada, the International Air Transport Association, and the Air Transport Association of America (now known as Airlines for America).

Most recently, Mr. Giguere was an independent aviation consultant, advising a range of firms. From 2012-2018, Mr. Giguere was Chief Operating Officer and Deputy Chief Executive Officer at Ornge, the Ontario-based not-for-profit air ambulance service, where he was responsible for Safety, Aviation, Paramedic Operations and the Operations Control Centre ensuring a coordinated multi-team response in support of patient care.
